# FRANFARE

If you are a fan of NPR (National Public Radio), if you have ever supported the United Way or Special Olympics, if you have ever made a financial gift in support of a political party or candidate, if you attended a college or university, or if you simply have a telephone, then you are familiar with the regular request for money. Some hold yearly campaign drives, some seem to have non-stop all-year campaigns. When the calls become too frequent, I listen for the Caller ID before I pick up the phone. Sometimes I inform the caller that I don't take telephone solicitations before hanging up; if I am interested in supporting the cause they represent, I insist they mail me information and refuse to make any commitment over the phone. Requests for funds that come via email go straight to the trash.

How does the church's annual Stewardship Campaign compare with all these other requests for money? First the similarities:

- All are requests for our money;
- Like many of the other causes, the church relies on donations for the bulk of its income;
- The church is one of many institutions that helps the less fortunate;
- By supporting any of these causes, we add our few dollars to those of many, many others to generate enough money to make a difference.

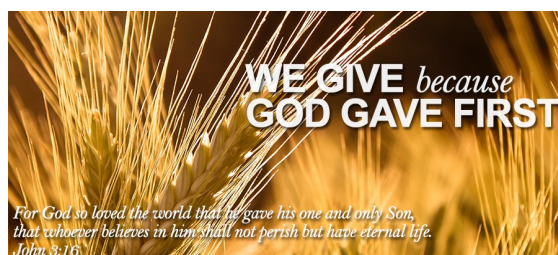
The principal difference lies in the reason we give to the church.

- Some people take a fee-for-service approach to church giving. They put money in the plate when attending services and make contributions when a child is baptized or a family member married. These people rarely make pledges
- Many people consider their pledge to the church as a membership fee. Pay the fee and you can claim to the benefits -weddings, baptisms, funerals, fellowship, etc.
- Others embrace the full meaning of stewardship. These people understand that everything they have is a gift from God, and their charitable giving to the church and other organizations is their response to God's gift. Whether they are rich or poor or somewhere in between, these people are the most generous.

Some churches emphasize the tithe (10%) as the standard for giving. I adopted that standard when I first began working for a salary. Because I consider 10% of my income to be God's, or rather my response to the 100% that God has given me, because I automatically give 10% of what I earn to the church and other charitable causes, God has used that practice to shape my spirit more and more into the self-giving image of Jesus Christ.

This stewardship season, consider why you give to the church. If you have not yet embraced the concept of giving to God in thanksgiving for all God has given you, I encourage you to try it on for size. You don't have to tithe, it's the reason you give that matters most.

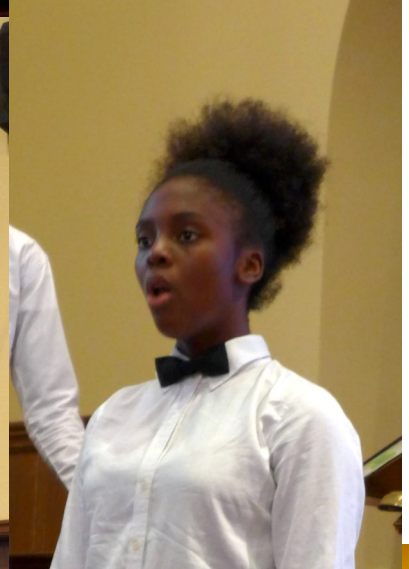
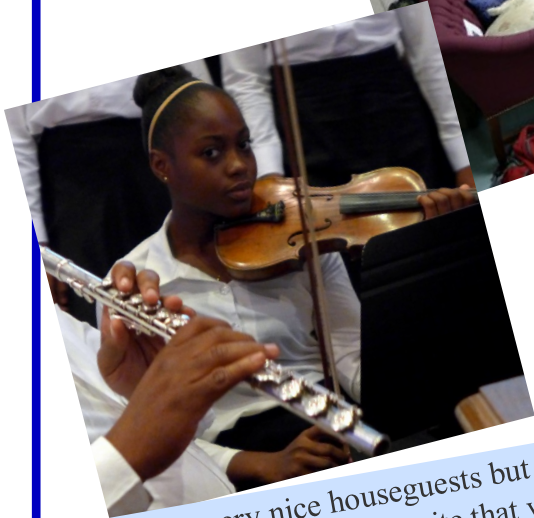
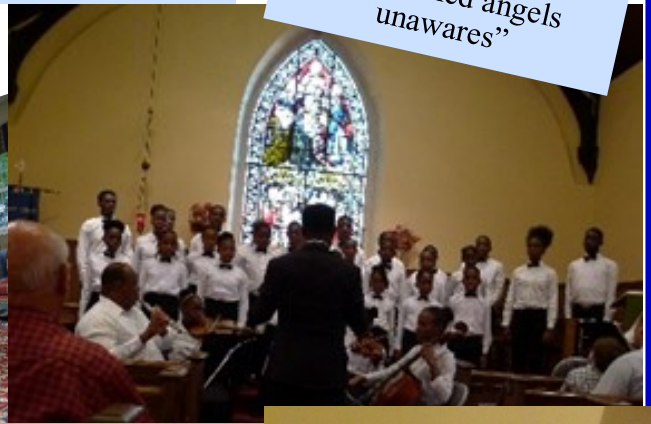
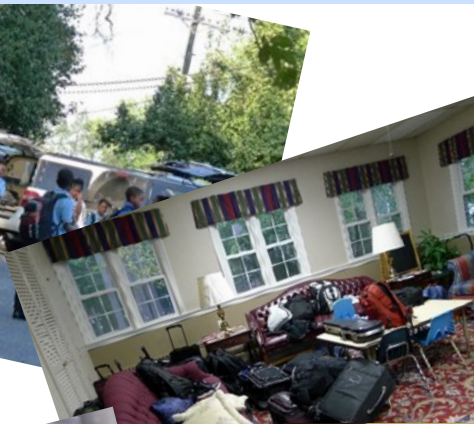




## HAITIAN CONCERT—SEPTEMBER 24, 2017

## NURSERY NEWS

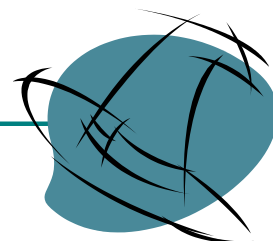

  - † Bob Newton and Roy Lancraft for making necessary repairs to outside lighting that will be much appreciated as the days get shorter.





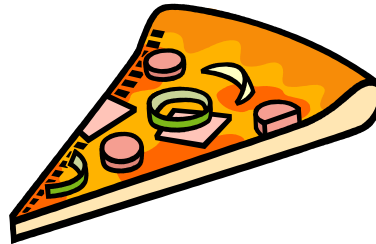
